On these Sundays, we will have children's sermons and music that will appeal especially to children during our 10:00 a.m. worship services. And, after worship we will have special activities for children and families from about 11:00 a.m. – 12:00 noon.

On June 14, we will have ice cream sundaes for everyone during our fellowship time. Children will plant flowers in front of the parish house and make Father's Day gifts during their activity time.

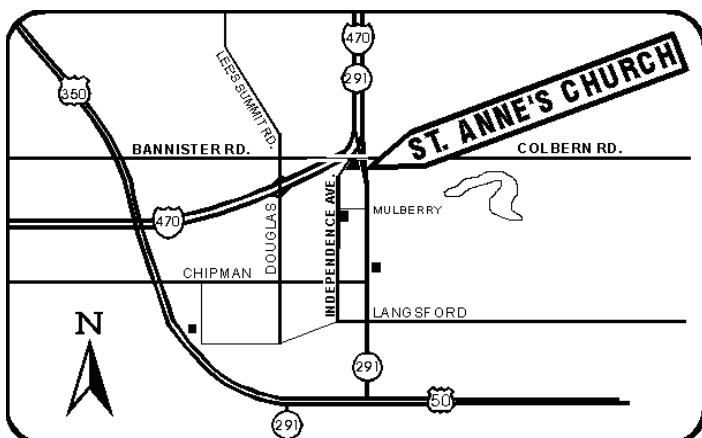
